Prague & Czech Republic (CZ) Current Situation



How many confirmed cases are there in Prague / CZ now?

So far, there are more than 10,000 confirmed cases of coronavirus at the Czech Republic area. The detailed tracking is available at the website of the Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic in Czech language. Update of the worldwide situation can be found here.



What are the security measures in place to prevent the spread of the virus in Prague?

- Starting May 25, face masks are mandatory to wear inside buildings and in means of public transportation only;
- o starting April 20, the Czech government announced gradual release of some of the emergency measures and will gradually open some types of the shops and services and the ban on mass cross-border transportation was also lifted;
- starting May 11, events up to 100 people held under strict sanitary conditions can take place; from May 25 up to 300 people, from June 8 up to 500 (events up to 2 500 pax can be hold in case the delegates are divided into five groups seated in the separated sectors) and from June 22, up to 1 000 can bel hold;
- o Czech Republic applies so called "traffic light" system as of June 15. Based on evaluation of epidemiologic situation, the EU+ countries will be divided into three groups according to a level of risk of COVID-19 low (green), medium (orange) and high (red) risk. EU+ citizens and citizens of other countries with the granted status of long-term resident in the EU may enter the Czech Republic without the necessity of having a negative PCR test and without the necessity to prove the purpose of travel in case they travel from the country with low risk (green).

Prague Airport Measures

Air carriers gradually re-open the air traffic from/to Prague. In course of July, 55 routes should be re-launched. Please, check the information available on the Prague Airport web and social media.



Prague Airport also <u>adopted the measures</u> to educate its passengers to create conditions to timely detect and prevent further spreading of the infection. There was a special crisis team created to deal with the current situation which cooperates very closely with all the public health authorities in the Czech Republic. Stricter sanitation rules apply within the airport area, such as frequent disinfection across terminals and gates after every boarding, there are more than 250 disinfection dispenser installed in the whole airport area and social distancing is applied.

Prague Public Transportation Measures

All the means of public transportation system are disinfected on a regular basis. Special disinfection, which effect should last two years, is has been tested in the selected means of transportation.

• Please note that the operation of the inter-regional transportation from/to Prague can be still limited due to the low number of passengers. Please, check the latest information on the websites of your transport company.

Other

City of Prague also decided to disinfect all the common areas at the buildings, where the apartments have been rented to tourists for short-term stays via Airbnb.

What are your recommendations for onsite arrangements?

Our recommendation is, especially, to follow the standard hygienic procedures. We also strongly recommend to read and follow the latest Key planning recommendations for Mass Gatherings in the context of the current COVID-19 outbreak published by the WHO (World Health Organization). In case, you booked flight tickets via our partner Czech Airlines, please note, that they will process the <u>first change of travel dates free of charge</u> for all existing and new individual bookings made before 31 March 2020 with a return date on or before 30 June 2020.



Are the venues prepared to take the necessary measures?

Yes, for example the Prague Congress Centre (PCC) is able to equip all bathrooms, cloakrooms, info desks and entrance areas with disinfection gels and increase the frequency of cleaning and disinfection of all areas. If required, the PCC may assign one of the gates exclusively for medical screening of all incoming guests to prevent entrance of infected visitors. The required personnel is 4 staff equipped with non-contact thermometers and protective equipment, per 500 delegates (250 CZK/hour/person).

Cubex Centre Prague is also taking increased hygienic measures to minimize the risk of spreading the coronavirus, including: intensive above-standard cleaning after every event, disinfection of air-conditioning units, disinfectants available for delegates, free thermometers for organizers to borrow, option to arrange external employee to monitor compliance with current restrictions and event hybridization possible, if government regulations will limit the number of participants attending the event. The health of the visitor is the highest priority for the O2 universum and therefore increased hygienic measures against the spread of the coronavirus have been taken. Regular disinfection of all areas, tailor-made catering to fit in current regulations and hygienic rules, disinfection stations are available for all visitors and there are regular health checks of the employees as well.
